<h3>Anti-Federalists</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep the Articles of Confederation • Against ratification of the Constitution <p>Approval by vote</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Favored power divided among state governments 	<h3>Federalists</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Toss the Articles of Confederation • Wanted a Federal Government • Supported ratification of the Constitution <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Favored strong central government- power would be divided among the state and national gov. and the three branches so the federal government would not become too powerful
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • People should be protected from the power of government by having clearly outlined rights- Demanded a BILL OF RIGHTS be included in the Constitution <p>Compromise = 9th Amendment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Very distrustful of government • Published <i>The Anti-Federalist Papers</i> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Believed the Constitution in its original form would protect the rights of the people- including a Bill of Rights in the Constitution is dangerous because it implies the gov. can deny any rights that are not listed in the Constitution <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Published <i>The Federalists Papers</i> in support of the new Constitution
