1. Congress created a Marines and Airforce of the United States.	To raise & support an army & navy
2. Congress has required all health related products that are shipped between states to have safety seals under their lids.	To regulate foreign & interstate trade
3. Congress created money for all fifty states.	Coin money
4. Congress increased the price of the postage stamp to \$0.49 cents.	Create a post office & postal roads
5. Congress is able to limit the number of immigrants to the United States	Make naturalization laws
6. Congress has the right to draft citizens into the armed forces.	To raise & support an army & navy
7. Sonia Sotomayor was selected to the Supreme Court.	To approve of presidential appointments
8. After the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor, President Roosevelt asked Congress to go to war.	Declare war
